SHAD QADRI SEEKS RE-ELECTION IN STITTSVILLE

Shad Qadri has announced his intention to seek re-election in Stittsville-Ward 6 in the 2010 municipal election.

“It has been an honour and a privilege to represent Stittsville residents at City Hall over the past four years. It is my hope that I will have the opportunity to continue to serve this community once more,” said Qadri. “I have accomplished what I had set out to do, and now I intend to set new challenges and benchmarks.”

Over the course of his first term, Qadri ushered in the opening of a new \$22 million West Division Patrol Station and a \$6 million west-end fire station, both located in Stittsville, coupled with two multi-million dollar expansions of the Goulbourn Recreation Complex, totalling \$13 million, and a \$2 million refurbishment of the Stittsville and District Community Centre.

More importantly, as part of the infrastructure stimulus funding program, a \$66 million investment was made into the widening of Hazeldean Road.

Citywide, Qadri’s focus has been on improving the City’s waste-handling practices, driving a task force aimed at investigating waste-to-energy and sustainable development initiatives for implementation in the Ottawa market.

Further, Qadri’s investigation into the City’s organizational structure and staffing levels led to the closure of 100 unfilled, yet funded, positions.

Qadri was first elected in 2006 with a 72 per cent share of the votes.
